## PALM SUNDAY

On the Sunday before the Feast of Great and Holy Pascha, and at the beginning of Holy Week, the Orthodox Church celebrates one of its most joyous feasts of the year. Palm Sunday is the commemoration of the Entrance of our Lord into Jerusalem following His glorious miracle of raising Lazarus from the dead. Having anticipated His arrival and having heard of the miracle, the people went out to meet the Lord and welcomed Him with displays of honor and shouts of praise. On this day, we receive and worship Christ in this same manner, acknowledging Him as our King and our Lord.

**Palm Sunday summons us to behold our King; the Word of God made flesh!** We are called to behold Him not simply as the One who came to us once riding on a colt, but as the One who is always present in His Church, coming ceaselessly to us in power and glory at every Eucharist, in every prayer and sacrament, and in every act of love, kindness and mercy. He comes to free us from all our fears and insecurities, to take solemn possession of our souls, and to be enthroned in our hearts. He comes not only to deliver us from our deaths by His death and Resurrection, but also to make us capable of attaining the most perfect fellowship or union with Him. He is the King who liberates us from the darkness of sin and the bondage of death. Palm Sunday summons us to behold our King, the vanquisher of death and the giver of life.

**Palm Sunday summons us to accept both the rule and the kingdom of God as the goal and content of our Christian life.** We draw our identity from Christ and His kingdom. The kingdom is Christ—His indescribable power, boundless mercy and incomprehensible abundance given freely to man. The kingdom does not lie at some point or place in the distant future. In the words of the Scripture, the kingdom of God is not only at hand [Matthew 3:2; 4:17], it is within us [Luke 17:21]. The kingdom is a present reality as well as a future realization [Matthew 6:10].

**Palm Sunday summons us to behold our King—the Suffering Servant!** We cannot understand Jesus' kingship apart from the Passion. Filled with infinite love for the Father, the Holy Spirit, and creation, in His inexpressible humility, Jesus accepted the infinite abasement of the Cross. He bore our grief and carried our sorrows; He was wounded for our transgressions and made Himself an offering for sin [Isaiah 53]. His glorification, which was accomplished by the Resurrection and the Ascension, was achieved through the Cross.

In the fleeting moments of exuberance that marked Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the world received its King; the King who was on His way to death. His Passion, however, was no morbid desire for martyrdom. Jesus' purpose was to accomplish the mission for which the Father sent Him. This is all accomplished during the forthcoming Holy Week.

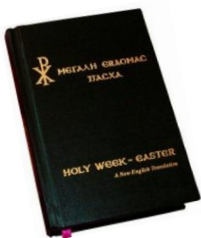


### Decorating the Kouvouklion

## Holy Week

Holy Week can be divided into two parts. The first part (Great and Holy Monday – Wednesday) is dominated by the Bridegroom Service, which is based on the parable of the ten virgins (Matt. 25:1-13). The image of Christ as the Bridegroom of the Church reminds us of the intimate love and union between God and His people, and the absolute commitment and dedication to Christ that should define our relationship with Him. The image of the Church can be seen as the “bride of Christ” reminding us that we are all married to Christ, and therefore complete dedication to Christ and His Church is not the vocation of a select few, but of every member of the Church.

Additionally, there are three key themes that appear these nights: repentance, vigilance, and the Second Coming. The parable of the ten virgins is, after all, a description about the Last Judgment. It may seem curious that the Second Coming is a predominate theme given that Holy Week speaks of the events surrounding Christ’s Suffering, Crucifixion, Death, and Resurrection. But this is the reason for Christ’s saving Passion and Resurrection. The last words of our Saviour on the Cross were, “It is finished.” The age of the law has passed, and the age of grace has begun. Through His ultimate Resurrection, the life of the age to come has already broken through.

The second half of Holy Week is the commemoration and celebration of our Lord’s Passion, Crucifixion, Death, Burial, and Resurrection. And it is here that we are invited to enter the very essence of Orthodoxy. Holy Week is not simply a religious custom, but the heart of Christianity and the fundamental purpose of the Church in this world: to proclaim the Good News that Christ has Risen, offering us Resurrection to eternal life.

Holy Week is a return to basics, a reintroduction to the very essence of Christian Orthodoxy. In it we see Christ’s power and ultimate victory over the darkened world and a loosing of Satan’s grip. It is a period whose ending is full of joy, fellowship, renewal, and worship of God whose life has been extended to us for all eternity.

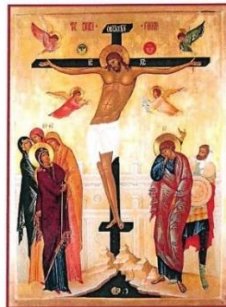
