The Church Fathers on...

The Publican and the Pharisee

Who should praise you? Let a neighbor praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger and not your own lips. – Proverbs 27

An old man given to simplicity questioned Abba Ammonas: *Three thoughts occupy me, should I either wander in the desert, go to a foreign land where no one knows me, or shut myself up in a cell without opening the door to anyone, eating only every other day?* Abba Ammonas replied, *“It is not right for you to do any of these three things. Rather, sit in your cell and eat a small portion every day, keeping the word of the Publican always in your heart, and you may be saved.”*

Abba Synclitiki said, *“Imitate the Publican and you will not be condemned as the Pharisee. Choose the meekness of Moses and you will find your heart which is a rock changed into a spring of water.”*

Repentance and humility are more important and higher than all the other virtues, continuing until the end of our life. Referring to the words of the Prophet David, St. John Chrysostom writes, *I did not fast, I did not keep vigil, I did not sleep on the bare earth, but I humbled myself and the Lord saved me.* – Elder Ambrose of Optina

When the foolish thoughts of counting up any of your good works enter into your head, immediately correct your fault and rather count up your sins, your continual and innumerable offences against the All-Merciful and Righteous Master, and you will find that their number is as great as the sands of the sea, whilst your virtues in comparison are as nothing. – St. John of Kronstadt

If repentance is too much for you, and you sin out of habit even when you do not want to, show humility like the publican; this is enough to ensure your salvation. – St. Peter of Damascus

HYMN OF PRAISE

SAINT SIMEON THE GOD-RECEIVER

When winter encountered spring, the aged Simeon was of good fortune: He encountered the long-awaited One Who, by the prophets, was foretold. The treasury of all heavenly riches was seen as a naked infant by Simeon. And in this manner Simeon prophesied: "Evening has descended upon my life; this One is set to conquer many and to raise many." Thus, the spirit spoke; the Elder's prophecy was fulfilled. Jesus became the measure and the standard, the source of happiness, peace and joy, but also, the target of disputes and maliciousness. One He lifts up, the other He overturns, and Paradise and Hades He opens to men. Let everyone choose whatever their hearts tell them. In Paradise with Christ! That is our heart's desire.

The Feast Day of the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple is our Lord's Forty-Day Blessing. Forty days from His Nativity is February 2. This is the last of the Great Feasts in the Orthodox Church having its axis around the Nativity. Speaking about the gradual spread of the celebration of Christ's Nativity, St. John Chrysostom said: "Magnificent and noble trees, when planted in the ground, shortly attain great heights and become heavily laden with fruit; so it is with this day." So it is also with the day of the Meeting of our Lord (Presentation).

From the beginning this day was commemorated among Christians, but the solemn celebration began in the time of the great Emperor Justinian. During his reign, a great pestilence afflicted the people in Constantinople and its vicinity, so that five thousand or more people died daily. At the same time, a terrible earthquake occurred in Antioch. Seeing man's inability to prevent these misfortunes, the Emperor, in consultation with the Patriarch, ordered a period of fasting and prayer throughout the entire empire. And, on the day of the Meeting itself (Feb. 2), he arranged great processions throughout the towns and villages, so that the Lord might show compassion to His people. And truly, the Lord did show compassion for the epidemic and earthquake ceased at once. This occurred in the year 544 A.D. From that time on, the Feast of the Meeting began to be celebrated as a great feast of the Lord. The tree, in time, grew and began to bring forth abundant fruit.



Apolytikion of the Presentation: "Lady full of grace, rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, for Christ our God, the Sun of righteousness has risen from you and He illumined those in darkness. And you, righteous Elder, be glad in heart, receiving in your embraces the One who liberates our souls and bestows on us the Resurrection."

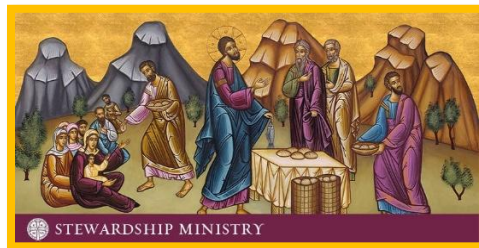
2026 Stewardship Drive is Underway

This call of Nehemiah to "rise up and build" invites us to become active members of the Church, the Body of Christ, to join in ministry and contribute according to our abilities. As Orthodox Christians, we understand that Stewardship is a community effort in which everyone plays a role.

To date, the parish has funded our Metropolis, Archdiocese, the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew Foundation, several outreach initiatives, and continued support of our growing and vibrant ministries.

Altar Boys

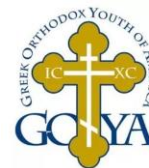
