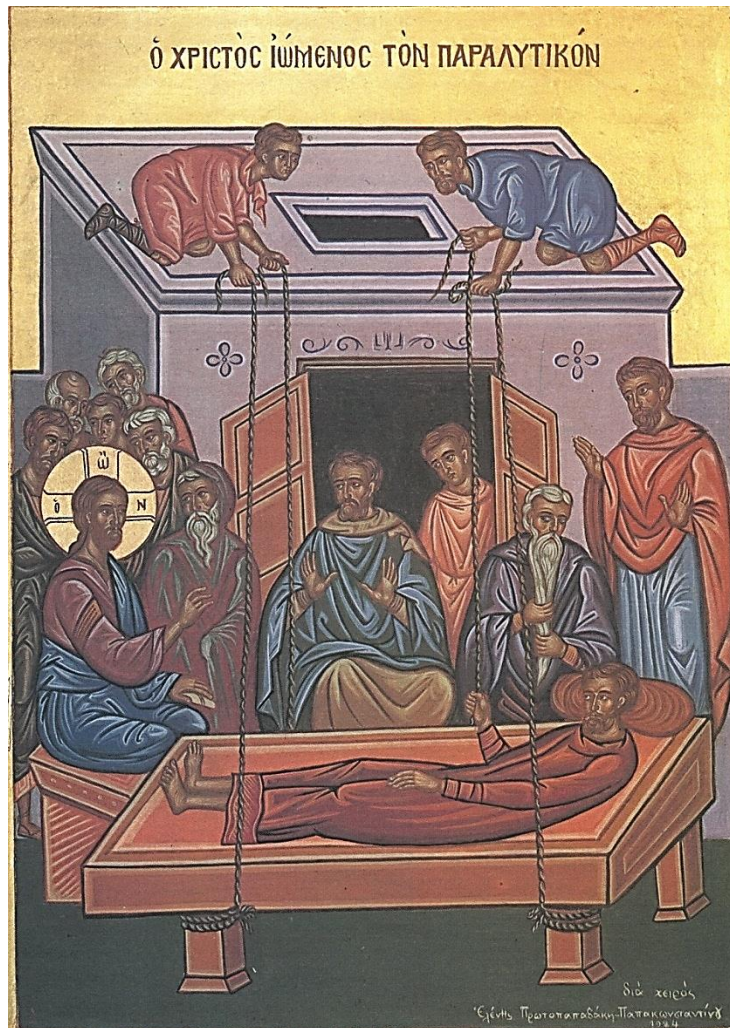

The Akathist Hymn is celebrated every Friday night throughout Great Lent. Service begins at 6:30 PM. In this service, we call upon the protection and aid of the Mother of God. She is the one who is “Quick to Hear” and the “Port and Harbor” of those tossed about upon the waves of this world.

Friday Night Lenten Potluck Dinner after Salutation Services

Fridays – March 29 & April 5, 12

Honoring the three pillars of Lent that are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, Holy Trinity parishioners are invited to the parish Lenten Potluck Dinner following each Akathist Service on Friday nights during Great Lent. First, as a parish, we will gather in church for prayer honoring with grateful hearts the Theotokos with the Salutation Service. Afterwards, united by God’s grace and as one family, we will break bread together. This is the first time since COVID that we are able to return to this beautiful practice. Each parishioner is asked (if possible) to bring a Lenten covered-dish. Since we practice the complete rule of the Lenten fast, please do not bring items with meat, cheese, dairy, eggs, or fish. Shellfish and oil are permitted.



The Divine Liturgy

What does the word Liturgy mean? Liturgy is a Greek word that in classical times referred to the performance of a public duty. In the Septuagint (the Greek translation of the Old Testament made some 300 years before the coming of Christ and still used by the Church today), it refers to worship in the Temple in Jerusalem. For Orthodox Christians, it has come to mean the public worship of the Church. Because Liturgy is always a corporate, communal action, it is often translated as the work of the people. Because it is prefaced by the word “Divine”, it is specifically the work of God’s people and an experience of God’s coming Kingdom here and now by those who gather to worship Him. This means that the Liturgy is not something that the clergy “performs” *for* the laity. The Liturgy was never meant to be a performance or a spectacle merely to be witnessed by onlookers. All who are present for worship must be willing, conscious and active participants and not merely passive spectators. The laity con-celebrate with the officiating clergy as baptized believers and members of the “royal priesthood...a people belonging to God” (1 Peter 2:9).

The Divine Liturgy is also called the Eucharist. The Christian Eucharist is a meal specifically connected with the Passover meal of the Old Testament commemorating the liberation of the ancient Israelites from slavery in Egypt as told in the Book of Exodus. At the Last Supper or what we call the Mystical Supper, Christ transformed this ancient Passover ritual into an act done in remembrance of Him: His life, teaching, death and resurrection. He is the new and eternal Passover lamb. His sacrificial death and resurrection from the dead frees humanity from slavery and sin, evil and death. This opens the path to forgiveness and liberation, offering eternal life and the coming of the Kingdom of God. *Eucharistia* is the ancient Greek word for “thanksgiving” or “gratitude.” The Eucharist is an expression of gratitude to God for the gifts of His Son and Spirit, our redemption and freedom.

The Prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian

The Prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian is the quintessential Lenten prayer said every day throughout Great Lent. Incorporate this prayer into your own daily Lenten devotions. This simple prayer allows us to become more aware of our Lord and the many virtues we need to acquire and the vices that need to end.

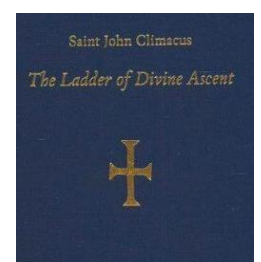
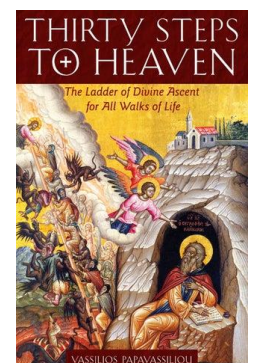
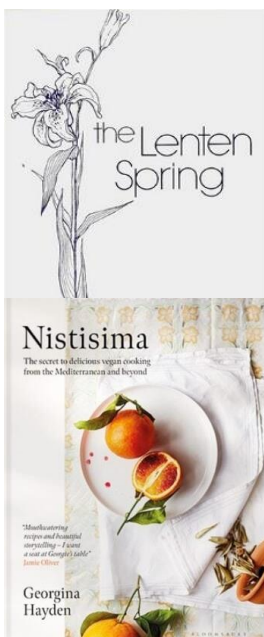
But give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience, and love to Thy servant.

Reading the Communion Prayers - Pages 60-63 of Divine Liturgy Book

In Her wisdom, the Church provides beautiful prayers to say before and after receiving Holy Communion. These prayers are part of our Eucharistic preparation which also includes a complete fast in the morning (i.e., nothing by mouth) before receiving the Precious Gifts. As these prayers are read by the clergy in the altar, the faithful should join in at the same time by reading them silently. These Communion Prayers speak to us about faith and forgiveness; humility and cleansing of sins; and a feeling of unworthiness in the presence of the Almighty God. Finally, they reveal the benefits of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. The conclusion of these prayers is seen in the priest who asks for forgiveness from his co-celebrants in the altar and then from the entire congregation. In like manner, each of us must ask for forgiveness from our brethren before approaching the Holy Chalice.

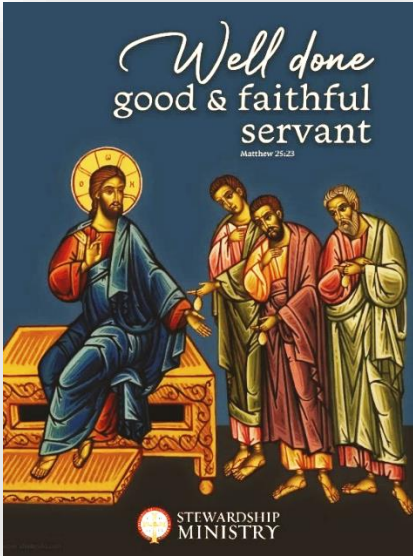

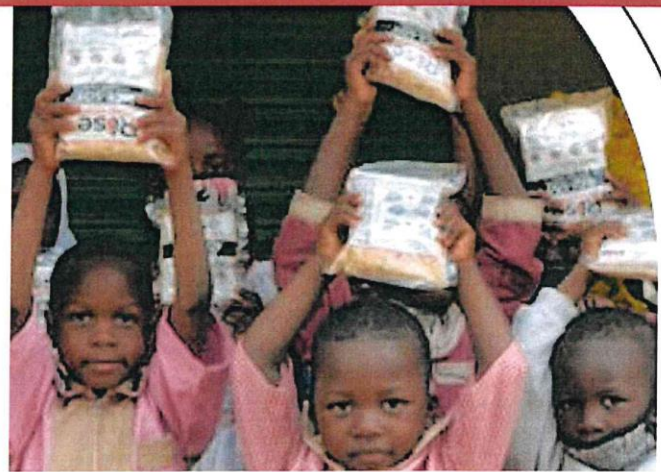
