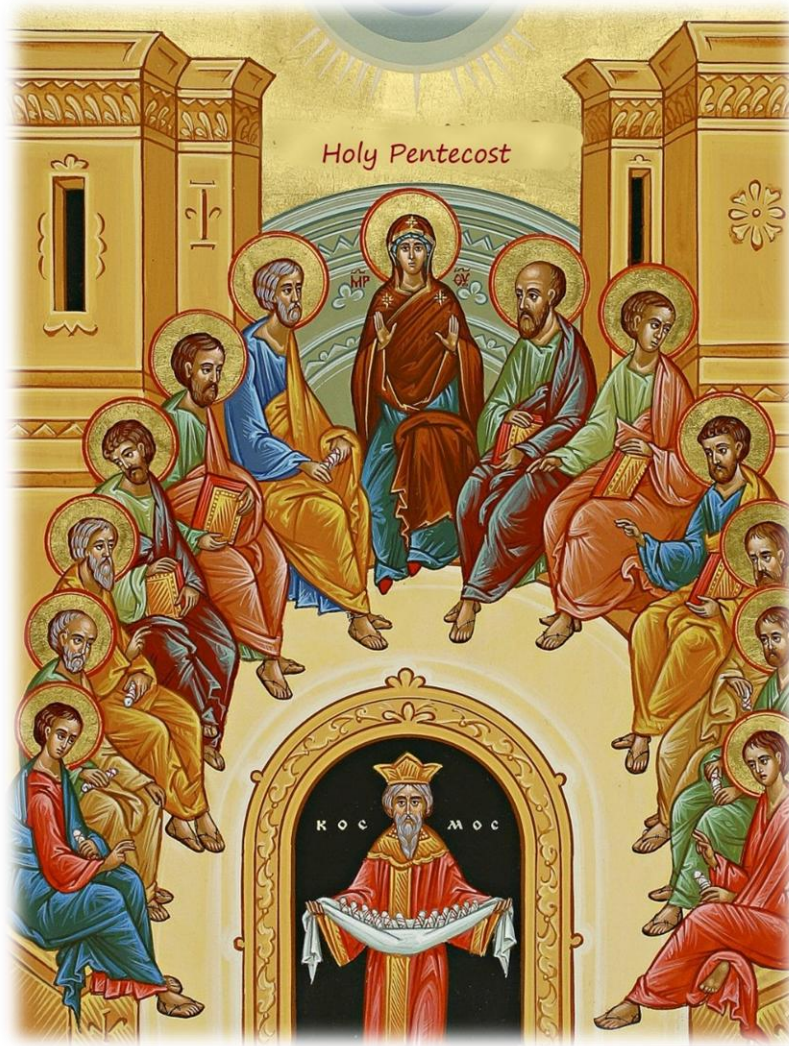

It's our Anniversary

Save the Dates...

In 2026, Holy Trinity celebrates 60 years of Orthodox witness and service. As a parish we will honor this milestone and the founders who with vision and faith established our beloved parish in 1966. The parish will host a grand celebration on Sunday, October 4 and we hope that you can join us for Liturgy and an Anniversary Luncheon. This will be followed by an evening gala and parish dance on Saturday, November 14. Details will be forthcoming but mark your calendars from now.

“Behold we now celebrate the feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Spirit, the fulfillment of the promise and also of our hope.” – Hymn of Vespers

The most important aspect of celebrating the Great and Holy Day of Pentecost is unity. “They were all with one accord in one place.” – Acts 2:1. We picture the upper room where the eleven were gathered with the Lord’s mother, the Panagia. Retiring from the world, praying together and united in purpose, they waited for God’s power to descend.

“Suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house...then appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them.” – Act. 2:2-3. God’s appearance is like a holy breeze, filling the room completely with a refreshing flow of grace that relaxes and pacifies the soul. Then upon each person the Holy Spirit rested in the form of fiery tongues. God’s action during the Day of Pentecost is to enlighten and unite. Fire gives off intense energy, and tongues of fire give the ability to preach and unite all humankind through the warmth of the Gospel. Notice God’s ineffable power as the Holy Spirit utterly bypasses the need for spoken language. Ever since the Tower of Babel [Genesis 11], human language has divided and confused the nations. Even to this day, a spoken language sets boundaries as it excludes those who do not properly understand that language. The inability to properly understand others brings division. When divisions exist, people and nations exclude, dividing one against another.

With God’s blessing, the inclination to exclude has been wiped clean away by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. No longer is brother set against brother, or nation against nation. Now everyone is a brother being united by the Spirit. In God’s presence, nations no longer exist, for there is but one true kingdom – the Kingdom of God. God’s Kingdom is made a present reality by the descent of the Holy Spirit and through His presence, confusion and division are erased. God dialogs with us directly through His Spirit which surpasses the limitations and segregations of human language. Pentecost is a witness that every person can now receive God indwelling within him, every person can now speak a holy and divine language. And today the message of the Gospel becomes universal, accessible to all men, to all races, to all nations. On Holy Pentecost, God communicates not through the tongues of men but through that which surpasses human language – God speaks to us through tongues of fire.

HOLY PENTECOST

Today is celebrated one of the most important feast days of the Christian Church – Holy Pentecost. Today is the birthday of Apostolic Teaching. All Christian denominations, Orthodox, Protestant, and Roman Catholic, observe this magnificent feast with joy and admiration of God's wonder. The word Pentecost is a Greek word meaning "*fiftieth*," the designation for fifty days after Pascha.

Just before Jesus Christ ascended into heaven on the fortieth day after His Resurrection, He promised His faithful disciples and followers that very soon the power of the Holy Spirit would be with them, giving them spiritual strength to carry the message of Christ throughout the world, which is precisely Apostolic Teaching. The followers of Christ, being simple fishermen and possessing very little education, gathered together in the "upper room," waiting for the promised sign from heaven. Suddenly on the fiftieth day after Pascha, there came a great sound from heaven which was like the rushing of a mighty wind, filling the house where the disciples were. Then a miracle happened! Great tongues of fire were seen over each of the heads of the disciples. It was the power of the Holy Spirit which brought divine inspiration to all in the house. They began to speak many different languages, as they were "filled with the Holy Spirit." This was the fulfillment of the promise which the Lord had given to them. – *Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4-5; Joel 3:1-3*

St. Peter delivered the first apostolic sermon in Jerusalem on this first Pentecost. Upon hearing his apostolic message, over 3,000 people believed and were baptized on that day. The disciples traveled to the far corners of the earth pronouncing the apostolic message of salvation in Jesus Christ to all peoples and nations. During the Divine Liturgy today, all Orthodox Christians take part in the beautiful service, known as "the service of kneeling." Three meaningful prayers are read about the miracle of Pentecost. During each prayer, the entire congregation kneels before God to pray. In like manner as the disciples, we wait for the appearance of the Holy Spirit. As we entreat the Holy Spirit to appear and hover in our midst, God makes us worthy to participate in our own personal Pentecost. Being filled with the Holy Spirit, we become apostles of the faith!

Having thus received the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are entrusted with the same apostolic mission given to the disciples. We, too, are commissioned to go into the world and spread the apostolic message of salvation. May the Lord our God, the All-Holy Spirit, come upon each of us today.

Stewardship

In the life of the Church, Stewardship is a sacred response to God's abundant blessings. It is how we actively participate in the life of the parish, offering our time in service, our talents in ministry, and our treasure in support of Christ's mission.

Holy Trinity is our spiritual and cultural center, a place like no other, rooted in faith. It nurtures joy and a deep sense of purpose in giving. Our parish remains a vibrant spiritual home thanks to your faithfulness. Stewardship directly impacts:

- Meaningful outreach ministries, serving those in need in our local community and beyond
- It sustains and grows our youth and young adult programs, forming the next generation in the Orthodox faith
- It preserves and expands our liturgical life, education, and parish ministries, ensuring that the fullness of Orthodoxy is lived and experienced

Each of these expressions brings our faith to life, not only within our walls, but in the world. Each year, we prayerfully establish a Stewardship goal that reflects both our needs and our mission.

For 2026, our parish Stewardship goal is \$650,000.

To date, the faithful have committed approximately \$466,000, while in previous years at this point, we were closer to \$490,000. Historically, by May we have 81% of Stewardship Cards received. Currently, we have collected 71%.

This leaves a sizable gap as we seek to fully fund the ministries and mission entrusted to us.

Holy Trinity is a family of believers. As the faithful, we put our personal trust and financial resources in God's hands. Take a leap of faith to move forward. Please offer Holy Trinity as much as possible for God's glory.
