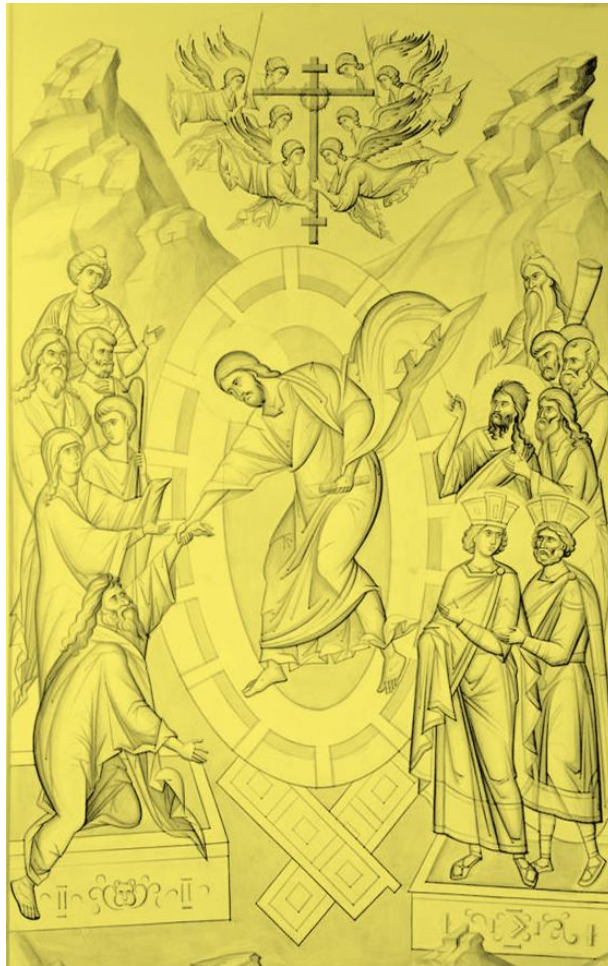

Stewardship

In the life of the Church, Stewardship is a sacred response to God's abundant blessings. It is how we actively participate in the life of the parish, offering our time in service, our talents in ministry, and our treasure in support of Christ's mission.

Holy Trinity is our spiritual and cultural center, a place like no other, rooted in faith. It nurtures joy and a deep sense of purpose in giving. Our parish remains a vibrant spiritual home thanks to your faithfulness. Stewardship directly impacts:

- Meaningful outreach ministries, serving those in need in our local community and beyond
- It sustains and grows our youth and young adult programs, forming the next generation in the Orthodox faith
- It preserves and expands our liturgical life, education, and parish ministries, ensuring that the fullness of Orthodoxy is lived and experienced

Each of these expressions brings our faith to life, not only within our walls, but in the world. Each year, we prayerfully establish a Stewardship goal that reflects both our needs and our mission.

For 2026, our parish Stewardship goal is \$650,000.

To date, the faithful have committed approximately \$400,000, while in previous years at this point, we were closer to \$470,000.

This leaves a sizable gap as we seek to fully fund the ministries and mission entrusted to us.

How can each of us prayerfully consider our role in ensuring the continued strength and growth of our parish? We are invited - each according to our ability - to renew and deepen our commitment to stewardship. Please help us!

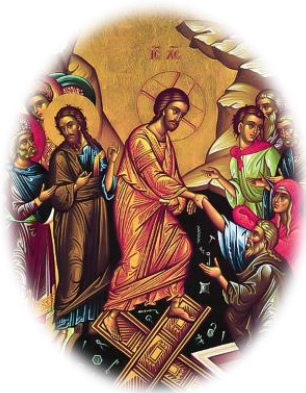
- If you have not yet pledged, you are warmly invited to make a commitment.

Together, through sacrificial and joyful giving, we can close this gap and meet our goal. Stewardship is ultimately an act of faith. It reflects our trust in God, our love for His Church, and our commitment to one another as the Body of Christ.

Let us move forward united in purpose, so that Holy Trinity may continue to be a beacon of faith, hope, and love serving Christ in all we do.

Sunday of the Paralytic

Who among us can boast that he is strong, courageous, bearing all the misfortunes of this age, fulfilling all of Christ's commandments? Deliver us, O Lord, if such a person stands in our midst-for that person is a fraud! The Apostle Paul says: *Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong* (2 Cor 12:10). But the Apostle did not deprive himself of one thing: strong faith and undoubting hope in the Savior. "The power of God is made perfect in weakness!"



How can the world, which does not believe in God and preaches the illusory omnipotence of mankind, understand this? The Lord came into the world to save paralytic sinners, and us among them. Let us recognize ourselves for who we are in fact. The Apostle James writes: *For what is your life? It is a vapor that appears for a little time, and then vanishes away* (James 4:14). No matter how strongly our pride rebels against this, let us look dispassionately at the universe: the myriads of planets, the thousands of generations, endlessly following one another, the billions of people who are erased from the memory of their descendants and their neighbors.

Something within us tells us unmistakably that man is something more than vapor. Our life, yes, is transient and withering, like the grass under the hot summer sun. Recall in the Psalter: *as the flower of the field, so hath he blossomed forth* (Ps. 103:15). But the soul – a unique human personality created by God – its story in time and eternity is altogether different. If the soul is united with its Creator and God, then it becomes the most beautiful, the most precious of everything that is on earth. In the memory of God, in God such a soul receives not simply life, but life "more abundantly," as the Apostle Paul writes. He cannot with human words express in any other way the mystery revealed to him of the future age. And the same Apostle writes: *Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him* (1 Cor 2:9).

In the lives of each one of us, there will still be moments of weakness and failures, what we call paralysis. They can last for many years, just as with the

paralytic at the Sheep pool, of which the Gospel speaks. The paralytic lay for many years awaiting healing, but he believed that a messenger of God would come and heal him. The Lord, “trampling down death by death,” can give eternal life to us, who one day will be in the grave, and who will free us from this eternal and final paralysis.

Let us not think highly of ourselves; let us not be surprised by our infirmities; let us not, because of them, fall into despair and despondency. Let us sincerely, with all our strength, strive towards correction, struggling against the evil and sin living within us. Let us firmly believe that our Lord Jesus Christ will help us in this. He loves us, because we are His children. We, who recognize ourselves as paralytics and who are asking help from our Heavenly Father, will not be left behind, for He gives us His invincible power. Only by this are we strong.

The Rules of a Good Life

What are the rules for living a good life? In the first place, love the Lord with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.

Then to love your neighbor as yourself.

Do not kill. Do not commit adultery.

Do not steal or covet.

Do not bear false witness.

Respect all people as an image of God.

Do not do to others what you would not wish to have done to you.

Deny yourself in order to follow Christ.

Be the master of your own body, not the devil.

Help the poor and clothe the naked.

Visit the sick and bury the dead.

Assist those in distress and comfort those with a faint heart.

Consol the afflicted.

Do not allow anything to come before the love of Christ.

Do not give a door for anger to enter.

Do not meditate on revenge.

Do not harbor deceit in your heart.

Seek peace and reach out to your neighbor.

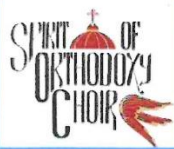

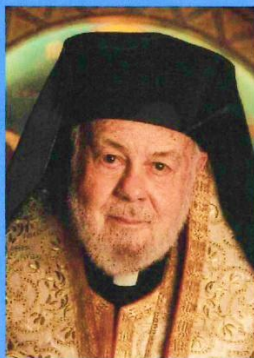
