### Great Hierarchical Vespers at Holy Trinity - Thursday, November 21

It is with great honor that Holy Trinity will host for the first time the Feastday of the new patron saint of the Metropolis of NJ, St. Iakovos of Evia. Great Vespers, presided by His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos with area clergy, will begin at 6:00 PM. Altar boys from around the area also will be in attendance to be given a special cross to wear at all services. All Holy Trinity parishioners with the faithful from the area are invited. A celebratory reception will follow in the Bouras Center. Make plans from now to mark your calendar for this beautiful feast of St. Iakovos.

### The Holy Martyr St. Victor – November 11

St. Victor came from Italy and was a Roman soldier in the reign of the Emperor Antoninus. While serving in the region of Damascus, he was denounced for his faith in Christ to the military governor, the Dux Sebastian. For the supernatural wisdom and steadfastness of his replies to the questions and deceitful suggestions of the governor, he was put to torture. They broke his fingers and threw him into a raging furnace, where he remained for three days unharmed. On coming forth, he was made to drink a deadly poison. Seeing it was without effect, the sorcerer who prepared it was converted to the Christian Faith. Other torments were practiced upon the valiant soldier of Christ: his sinews were torn out; a mixture of quicklime and vinegar was poured down his throat. Last of all, they tore out his eyes and left him hanging by his feet for three days, whereupon he gave up his soul to God and found everlasting rest.



### The Holy Martyr St. Stephanie – November 11

St. Stephanie was a pious Christian woman who, after the death of her husband, spent her life in prayer and fasting. She was present at the martyrdom of St. Victor. As she glorified God for the courage of the martyr, she saw in the spirit two crowns rising up to heaven. Thereupon she confessed Christ at the governor's tribunal, for which she was tied to two palm trees bent

toward each other and held in place by ropes. At the command of the governor, the ropes were cut and the trees sprang back to their usual position, thus tearing apart the body of the saint.

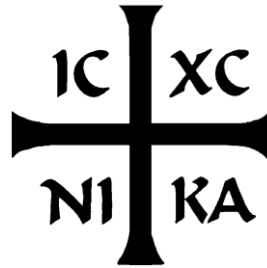
### Veterans Day - Monday, November 11

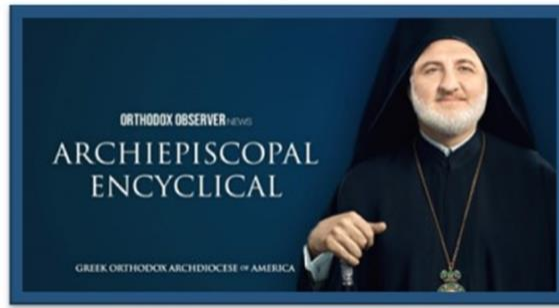
## Greek School Registration is Now Open

Archepiscopal Encyclical for the Feast of the Archangels  
Feast of the Synaxis of the Holy Archangels

November 10, 2024

Unto the Most Reverend and Right Reverend Hierarchs, Pious Priests and Deacons, the Monks and Nuns, Presidents and Members of Parish Councils, Honorable Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Members of Leadership 100, the Day and Afternoon Schools, Philoptochos Societies, the Youth, Greek Orthodox Organizations, and the entirety of the Christ-named Plenitude of the Holy Archdiocese of America:

And there was no one who stood with me against them, except Michael, your prince.  
*(Daniel 10:21)*

Beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

In the visions of the Prophet Daniel, Archangel Michael is revealed as a powerful force for good and protection against every possible evil. If you look through the Holy Scriptures, you will read of Angels appearing in all manner of places — sometimes in numbers that even defy the imagination. But we should always bear in mind that “Angel” means “messenger,” someone who is delivering to us an important communication from the Heavenly Realm.

Every year, on November 8, we celebrate the Synaxis of the Holy Angels — all Nine Ranks of them, who are led by their Chief Commanders, Michael and Gabriel. At the same time, we take time to remember Saint Michael’s Home, our Archdiocesan Institution that cares for the elderly. Archangel Michael is considered the residents’ special protector and guardian, who stands with them in this life and the next.

This year, let us all consider a donation — of any size — to Saint Michael’s Home in order to support the generation that came before us. Holy Scripture speaks of a moment when Archangel Michael was the only one to take a stand and make a defense. But the message is clear, all of us can take our place with the Holy Archangel to become an impenetrable wall of support and prayer for our aged. And in doing so, we will contribute to the construction of the new walls that will house and protect our elderly at the new Saint Michael’s Home.

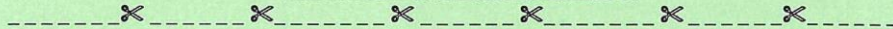
