Have you ever met one of those positive thinkers who comes along, slaps you on the back and says, “Chin up! Shoulders back! Get a spring in your heart and a bounce in your step!” The fact is that unless you get connected with some source of power, your chin isn’t going to lift up, your shoulders aren’t going to stay back, and any bounce you might have put into your step just isn’t going to remain there. Why are some people full of “life” each day, ready for any task that comes along? Are these people drawing upon some “secret” source of power?

The place to find this source of power is no secret. Jesus talks about it when He says, “I Am the Vine, you are the branches, He who abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing” (John 15:5).

Branches receive their nourishment from the vine, so likewise, Christians receive their “life” by abiding in Christ and by remaining connected to Him through faith, prayer, the Bible, and the sacraments. They find *life* in Christ. As a result, they are not only made alive *to God* but are also kept alive *for God*, to love and serve Him. In Him there is fullness of life. “And we all received of His fullness” (John 1:16).

“I Am the Way,” said Jesus. Without that way there is no real goal or destination. “I Am the Truth,” said Jesus. Without that truth there is no real knowing. “I Am the Life,” said Jesus. Unless we have that life there is no real living. “I have come that people might have life, and that they may have life in all its fullness” (John 10:10).

Jesus is always pro-life. He calls on us to repent: to turn from sin, which is death, to life, which is life. "You refuse to come to me that you may have life," said Jesus (John 5:40). Listen to what St. Paul wrote to a little group of Christians in Ephesus: "To you who were spiritually dead...Christ has given life...But even though we were dead in our sins, God was so rich in mercy that He gave us the very life of Christ" (Ephesians 2:1-5 Phillips). Dead once, but alive now in Christ. Fullness of life!

Two caterpillars sat watching a butterfly floating overhead. After some time, one caterpillar said to the other, "You wouldn't get me up there floating around in midair even for a million dollars!"

Of course, the unsuspecting caterpillar was little aware he was gazing on his own destiny. Christ came to turn earthbound caterpillars into heaven bound butterflies through the fullness of His life. Let Christ be our destiny for future life.

The Synaxis of the Archangels Michael and Gabriel And all the Heavenly Bodiless Powers

On November 8, the Church commemorates the Synaxis of the Heavenly Bodiless Powers, Michael, the most glorious and splendid Chief Commander of the bodiless Powers, has shown much beneficence and grace to the human race. Archangel Michael first appeared to Patriarch Abraham, then to Lot when he rescued him with his daughters from the fire sent by God, and the destruction of Sodom. After this, he appeared to Patriarch Jacob when he rescued him from the murderous hands of his brother Esau. He went before the encampment of the children of Israel when they were liberated from bondage in Egypt, and together with the pillar of fire and of cloud, he made easier the difficulty of their journey.

Also with the coming of the Gospel of Christ during this time of new grace, Archangel Michael brought together the rivers which once were released by the impious against the holy spring of Chonae and against the divine Church. And many other things are recorded about him in the divinely inspired Scriptures. For this reason, we have him as a protector and guardian of our lives for our defense, and we celebrate today his all-revered festival, for which reason it is called a Synaxis.

Satan was an angel of divine rank. Out of supreme pride, he exalted himself against the Creator and Master of all. He boasted of placing his throne in the clouds of heaven to become like the Highest. As a usurper, he put his mind to endless saying, "I will ascend into heaven. I will place my throne above the stars of heaven and be like the Most High!" - Isa. 14:13. But no one can outrun the Sun of Righteousness and because Lucifer tried to take the place of the One True God he fell from heavenly glory and his archangelic office. For this reason the Lord said, "I saw Satan fall as lightning from heaven." (1k. 10:18)

Together with him an order of Angels fell, who sprung away from God due to their pride, and fell with their leader the devil. And they were all darkened instead of illumined, becoming demons rather than Angels. Therefore, it is said at that

time the Chief Commander Michael, beholding the pitiful fall of the angels, understood the cause of their fall. And through subjection and humility, which he showed as a grateful servant and faithful housekeeper towards his Master, he carefully guarded his own glory and brilliance granted to him by God, as well as the glory of the other Angels' orders. Therefore by his humbleness and worship of God, it was determined by God Almighty that Michael should be the first among the Angelic orders.

Michael gathers together the choirs of Angels crying out: "Let us be attentive!" By this, we are to learn what happened with the fallen demons. They were once like the Angels but through pride lost everything and fell into the dark abyss. We must take care never to repeat their pride so that a similar fate may not befall us.

Michael teaches us to worship God and to praise His highly exalted name. He has shared with us the never ending angelic hymn, "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord Sabaoth, heaven and earth are full of Your glory!" (Isa. 6:3 & Revelation 4:8)

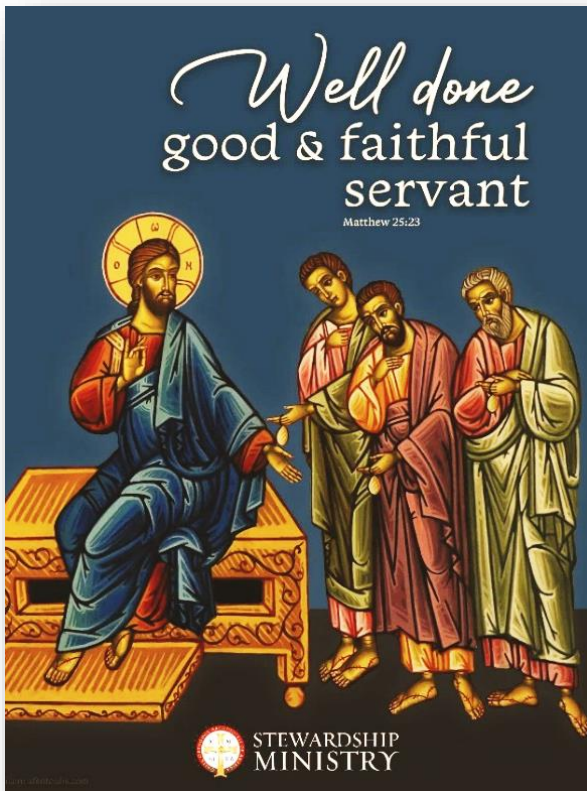
Together with the Archangel Michael the Synaxis commemorates the most beautiful and graceful Archangel Gabriel. He also showed much beneficence to the human race, as much in the Old as in the New Testament. The prophecy of Daniel gives us his name: when Daniel explained

Reading the Communion Prayers
On pages 60-63 of Divine Liturgy Book

In Her wisdom, the Church provides beautiful prayers to say before and after receiving Holy Communion. These prayers are part of our Eucharistic preparation which also includes a complete fast in the morning (i.e., nothing by mouth) before receiving the Precious Gifts. As these prayers are read by the clergy in the altar, the faithful should join in at the same time by reading them silently. These Communion Prayers speak to us about faith and forgiveness; humility and cleansing of sins; and a feeling of unworthiness in the presence of the Almighty God. Finally, they reveal the benefits of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. The conclusion of these prayers is seen in the priest who asks for forgiveness from his co-celebrants in the altar and then from the entire congregation. In like manner, each of us must ask for forgiveness from our brethren before approaching the Holy Chalice.



As Christian Stewards we are called to give back to God from the “first fruits” of our labor. We do this in large part by supporting Our Church, Our Spiritual Home. 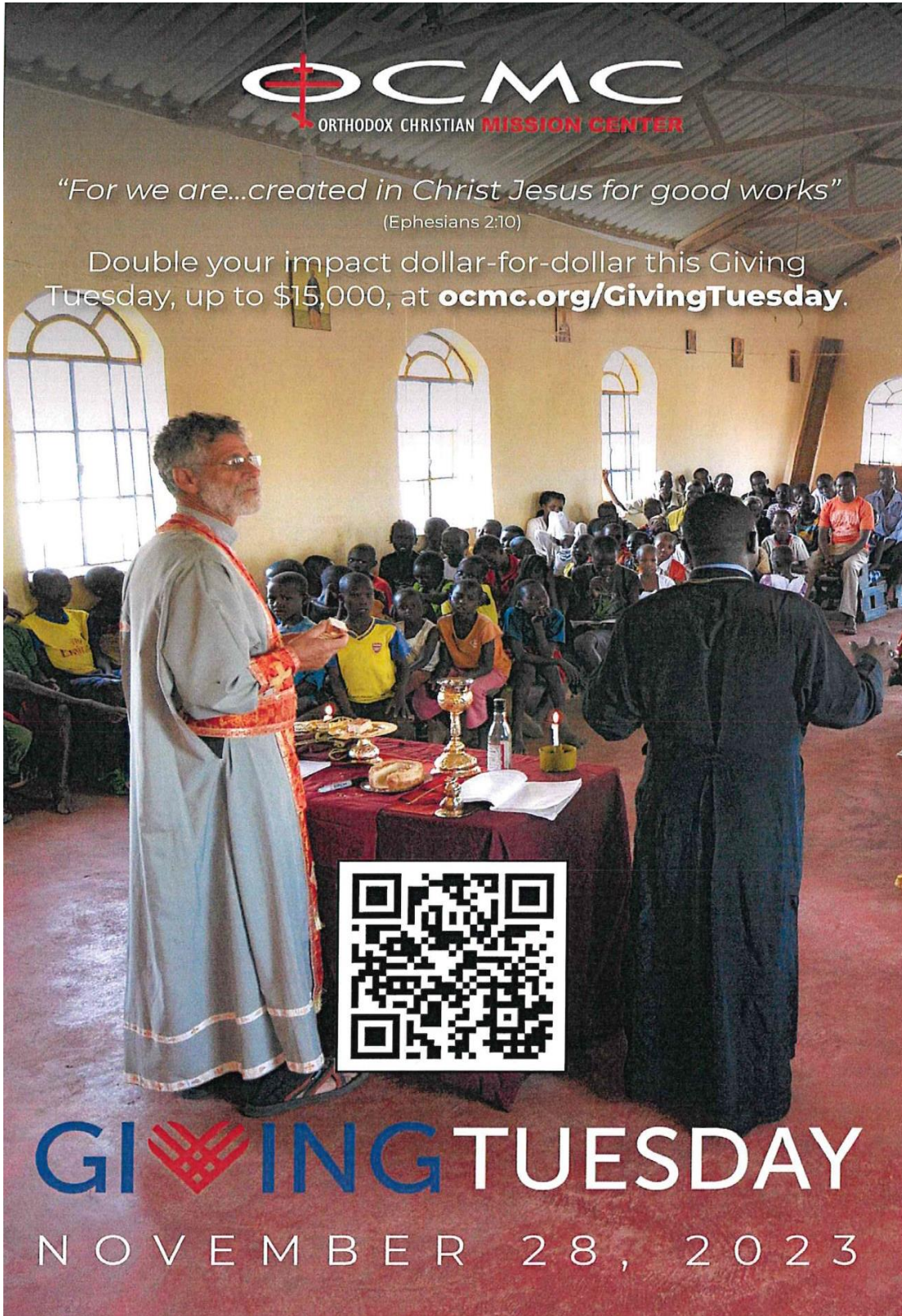
