Feast of All Saints

—June 30—

In the Holy Church, each day of the year is significant since it has a saint, or several saints appointed for daily commemoration. These are the holy ones who are known to have performed miracles when they were alive or whose relics are currently transmitting God's grace to the faithful. Saints are significant in the life of the Church, since they show that God is alive and still active in this world. Yes, these are people of the past, some of recent past and some from centuries long ago, but all of them lead the faithful to the future, showing us God's eternal kingdom the place where all the saints now reside.

The total number of saints is unknown to us. Indeed, God has revealed to us many of them. They are diverse people, coming from diverse backgrounds, whose lives were holy and completely dedicated to Him. These are the "known" saints whose names have been revealed and who are listed in the Ecclesiastical Calendar.

Yet beyond this great number of "known" saints are a vast array of other saintly people whose names God has chosen not to reveal to us. Even though their names are kept from us, their lives, like all saints, were grounded in the Orthodox faith displaying incredible love and complete devotion to Christ. These are the "hidden" saints known only to God. Their prayers and intercessions are just as relevant as those who have been revealed to us by God, for they have

been tested and have received crowns of glory. "O Lord, You test me and know me; You know my sitting down and my rising up; You understand my thoughts from afar; and You foresee all my ways." — Psalm 138:1-3

The first Sunday after Pentecost is dedicated to the memory of the saints known only to God. St. John the Apostle and Evangelist in the Apocalypse testifies to the fact that there are an abounding number of these saints.

"After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude, whom no one could number, from all nations, tribes, peoples, languages, standing before the Throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands... Then one of the elders answered, saying to me, 'Who are these arrayed in white robes, and where did they come from?' These are the ones who are coming out of the great tribulation, and they washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb. Therefore, they are before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night in His temple." (Revelation 7:9-15).

God is the only entity Who knows the heart and inner workings of all people. He knows those who are holy and live as strangers in this world. He knows every



person who is poor in spirit, who does not exalt himself above others, and who honestly considers himself more sinful and worse than others. The saint is the one who silently weeps for his sins and is in deep sorrow for all the injustices in the world. The holy person is the one who is hungry for truth and thirsts after

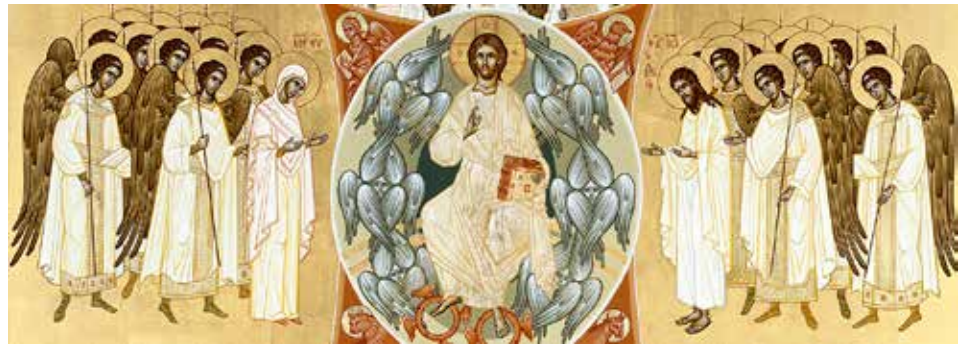

righteousness. He does not fight against the truth nor participate in revolution but seeks that which is higher – the divine Truth. The saint feels the pain of those who suffer unjustly and for those living in poverty. His heart is being continually purified by humility and the flowing of tears, by meekness and mercy. The saint is the one who shines before God for the purity of his heart allows the Light of Christ to flow through him.

On All Saints Day, Sunday, June 30 in addition to celebrating the Holy Twelve

Apostles, we also celebrate the countless unknown and anonymous saints, whose memories we celebrate with joy. Let it be, my brothers and sisters in Christ, that our own lives also be as such, as these holy ones of God. And at the hour of our death may we be united with that numerous multitude of people, clothed in white garments who have washed in the Blood of the Lamb, eternally glorify the One and Triune God, praising and thanking the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit unceasingly. ❖

Synaxis of the Holy, Glorious and All-Praised Twelve Apostles

— Commemorated on June 30 —

The Holy Twelve Disciples followed Jesus as He traveled and were eyewitnesses to His numerous wonders. After the Ascension of Christ, they continued His work of redeeming mankind from sin. On Ascension Day, Jesus commanded the apostles to go out and make disciples of all nations through baptism and to teach nations all that they had observed and all that He commanded. He enabled them to succeed in that he bestowed the Holy Spirit upon them on the Day of Pentecost.

The authority of the Apostles in the Church was unquestionable from the very beginning. Their powers were given to them by Christ. They preached boldly and acted as His representatives, teaching and speaking “in the Holy Spirit.”

The Feast of the Twelve Apostles is called the Synaxis of the Holy Apostles. The Synaxis of the Glorious and All-Praiseworthy Twelve Apostles appears to be an ancient Feast. The Church honors each of the Twelve Apostles on separate dates during the year but has established a general commemoration for all of them on the day after the commemoration of the Glorious and First-Ranked among the Apostles Peter and Paul.

The holy God-crowned Emperor Constantine the Great built a church in Constantinople in honor of the Twelve Apostles. There are instructions for

celebrating this Feast which date from the fourth century.

According to Scripture there are lists of the Apostles. Mt.10:2, Mark 3:14, Luke 6:12, Acts 1:13, 26.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Andrew the First-called is also commemorated on November 30. He was the brother of Saint Peter (June 29).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle James is also commemorated on April 30. He and his brother John are the sons of Zebedee, and were called "sons of Thunder" (Mark 3: 17).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle and Evangelist, virgin, and beloved friend of Christ, John the Theologian

is also commemorated on September 26 and May 8. He and his brother James are the sons of Zebedee, and were called "sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Philip is also commemorated on November 14.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Bartholomew is also commemorated on June 11 and August 25.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Thomas is also commemorated on October 6 and on the Sunday after Pascha.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle and Evangelist Matthew is also commemorated on November 16.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle James, the son of Alphaeus, is also commemorated on October 9.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Jude is also commemorated on June 19. He is also known as Thaddeus (but should not be confused with Saint Thaddeus of the Seventy, who is commemorated on August 21), and was the brother of Saint James (Iakovos) (October 23).

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Simon the Zealot is also commemorated on May 10.

The holy, glorious, all-laudable Apostle Matthias is also commemorated on August 9. ❖

The Assembly Of The Holy Glorious And Praiseworthy Apostles

Even though each of the Twelve Great Apostles has his own feastday during the year, the Church has set aside June 30 as a great synaxis feast for all the Apostles. All but one Apostle died a martyr's death. Only the beloved friend of Christ, St. John the Theologian, died outside martyrdom.

"Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We didn't pass it to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same, or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States where men were free."

He has sent Me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord"* (Luke 4:18-19). 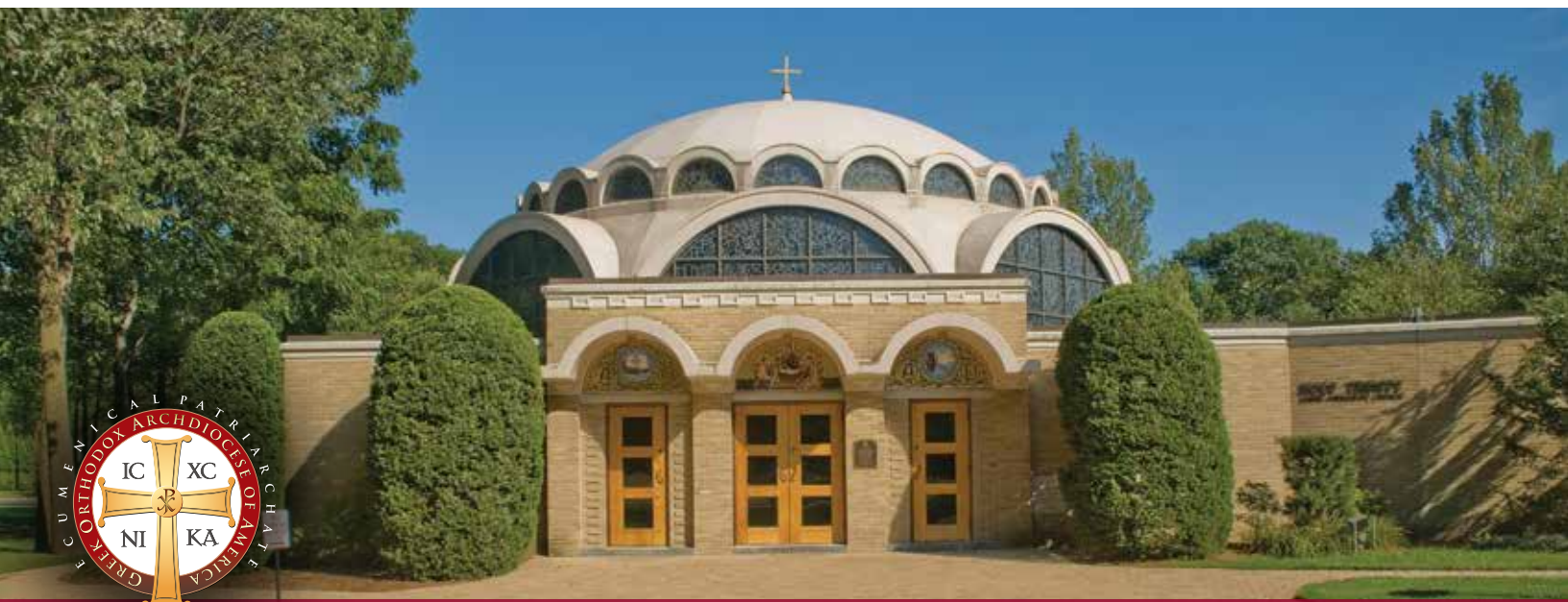
